# FIFTH ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE AGREEMENT

# ON THE MULTINATIONAL PEACE FORCE SOUTH-EASTERN EUROPE

## **PREAMBLE:**

The States - Parties to the Agreement on the Multinational Peace Force South-Eastern Europe (MPFSEE), signed in Skopje on the 26<sup>th</sup> of September 1998, as supplemented and amended by the First Additional Protocol there to, signed in Athens on the 12<sup>th</sup> of January 1999, the Second Additional Protocol signed in Bucharest on the 30<sup>th</sup> of November 1999, the Third Additional Protocol, signed in Athens on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June 2000, and the Fourth Additional Protocol, signed in Rome, on the 11<sup>th</sup> of December 2002,

Reaffirming their commitment to the aims and principles provided for in the Agreement on the MPFSEE (the Agreement)

Taking into account the need to address and resolve HQ SEEBRIG deployment issues.

Willing to further improve and update the Agreement in order to accommodate the enlargement of the MPFSEE initiative.

Reiterating the importance of MPFSEE as a regional initiative to enhance and deepen the cooperation between SEDM nations in the regional stability and international security.

Have agreed on the following:

### Article1

## In Article II of the Agreement, a new paragraph 5 is inserted, to read as follows:

"5. All operational and logistic aspects related to SEEBRIG activities are to be conducted/developed, in principle and where possible, in accordance with NATO's STANAGS".

### Article 2

### In Article IV of the Agreement, paragraph 8 is deleted

The numbering of the subsequent paragraphs is changed accordingly.

### **Article 3**

### In Article IV, paragraph 12 f of the Agreement is amended, to read as follows:

"f. Common budget, including -but not limited to- HQ SEEBRIG, Nucleus Staff, Mission and Exercise budgets

### **Article 4**

## In Article IV of the Agreement, a new paragraph is inserted at the end, to read as follows:

"The PMSC may grant Mission Medals, based on COMSEEBRIG proposal. The model and the title are to be approved and certified by the PMSC."

## Paragraph 1 of Article VII of the Agreement is amended, to read as follows:

"1. The structure of the HQ SEEBRIG to include a Nucleus Staff—and the Contingency Establishment (CE) for the HQ SEEBRIG and Personnel Establishment (PE) for the Nucleus Staff are included in Annex-C (Force Headquarters) of this Agreement. The staff slots -except the Brigade Command Group- are to be allocated to the Parties according to the ratio of their respective force contributions. MPFSEE Nations with Observer status may send Liaison Staff to HQ SEEBRIG."

#### Article 6

## In article VII of the Agreement, Paragraph 2 is amended, to read as follows:

"2. The Brigade Command Group shall be composed of the Commander of the Brigade, two Deputies, Chief of Staff and two Deputy Chiefs of Staff. The duties of the Brigade Commander shall be discharged on a two-year basis by an Army brigadier general of the Parties, where a colonel of the Host nation discharges the duties of the Chief of Staff in the Brigade. The other key command posts are to be rotational once every two-three years among the Parties. The exact length of rotation would be subject to advance consultation. All the replacements of HQ SEEBRIG Rotational Nucleus Staff have to be done after the completion of the designated tour of duty, including an overlapping period. The abovementioned replacement has to be done preferably before the end of September of the related year. The above-mentioned overlapping period applies also for every replacement of HQ SEEBRIG national Nucleus staff. The Host Nation would be excluded from COM, DCOMs and DCOS rotation."

### Article 7

### In article VIII of the Agreement, Paragraph 3 is amended, to read as follows:

"3. Combined training to include reconnaissance activities, command post/field training exercises, and crisis management exercises will be conducted according to commonly agreed-upon plans and programs."

## **Article 8**

## In article VIII of the Agreement, a new Paragraph 4 of the Agreement is inserted, to read as follows:

"4. Prior to deployment in a Peace Support Operation / Area of Operation (AOO), and subject to the approval of PMSC, HQ SEEBRIG "may" conduct joint training activities along with the Coalition/Alliance partners in order to meet the incoming mission requirements."

### **Article 9**

### In Article X of the Agreement, paragraph 2 is amended, to read as follows:

"2.A multinational logistics system is to be developed among the Parties. Separate agreements/MOUs could be concluded, on a case-by-case basis, to specify the principles for providing logistic support during operations and exercises."

## In Article X of the Agreement, paragraph 3c is amended, to read as follows:

"c. Emergency treatment in the civilian or military hospitals without any reimbursement, to Nucleus Staff Personnel and their dependants"

#### Article 11

## In Article X of the Agreement, a new paragraph 3 is inserted, to read as follows:

"3. In order to implement the provisions of the Agreement and its Additional Protocols, COMSEBRIG may be authorized, on a case by case basis, by PMSC, to sign Technical Agreements or other necessary mission-related arrangements, in accordance with approved SEEBRIG's SOPs."

The numbering of the subsequent paragraphs is changed accordingly.

### Article 12

### In Article XI of the Agreement, paragraph 2 is amended, to read as follows:

"2. Separate agreements, on a case-by-case basis, could specify the status of forces when the Brigade is deployed for peace support operations."

#### Article 13

### In Article XII of the Agreement, paragraph 3 is amended, to read as follows:

"3. Equipment purchased through common funds is the common property of the Parties. The rented and leased equipment/services through common funds will be supported using common budget, based on the contract.

The status of the common property, leased and rented equipment/services, as well as the national equipment provided by the host nation for temporary use, will be recorded in separate inventory lists and such acquisitions will be included, as full list, in annual reports."

#### Article 14

The abbreviation "WEU" is replaced by the abbreviation "EU" throughout the Agreement and its Additional Protocols. Moreover, the term "USD" will be replaced by "EURO" throughout the Agreement and its Additional Protocols.

#### Article 15

### In Annex A of the Agreement paragraph 2 is amended, to read as follows:

"Each maneuver battalion is to be composed of 2 or 3 companies, combat support and combat service support units if and as required and should have the capabilities such as: "

The text of the subparagraphs a, b and c remain unchanged.

## In Annex A of the Agreement paragraph 2d is amended, to read as follows:

"d. Communications, in principle, in accordance with NATO STANAG's"

### Article 17

In Annex C of the Agreement, paragraph 5a (7) (a) (VII) is amended to read as follows: "(VII) Development of guidelines for logistic and CIS interoperability."

#### Article 18

In Annex C paragraph 5a (7) (b) of the Agreement, a new paragraph (VI) is inserted, to read as follows:

"(VI) Coordination of CIS requirements in accordance with APPENDIX 6 (CIS IN DEPLOYED HQ LOCATIONS). Those criteria maybe amended by a PMSC decision".

### Article 19

### In Annex C paragraph 5a, a new subparagraph (8) is inserted, to read as follows:

"(8). CIS in deployed HQ locations, in accordance with Appendix 6, would require further separate arrangements between the Parties.

### Article 20

### In Annex C of the Agreement, paragraph 6e is amended, to read as follows:

"e. G5 (PLANS): mid/long-term and contingency plans."

## **Article 21**

### In Annex C of the Agreement, a new paragraph 6i is inserted, to read as follows:

"i. G-9 (CIMIC): CIMIC plans and policies, CIMIC Center, Joint Military Commission/JMC, programs and projects, CIMIC liaison functions and Public Information in peacetime if PIO is not activated."

The subsequent subparagraphs will be renumbered accordingly.

### Article 22

## In Annex D, Article II of the Agreement, paragraph 5 is amended, to read as follows:

"5. Nucleus Staff means the key headquarters personnel, permanently provided by the Parties and put under COMSEEBRIG authority for routine planning and other staff functions as detailed in Appendix 3 of the Annex C."

#### Article 23

## In Annex D, Article IV of the Agreement a new paragraph 4 is inserted, to read as follows:

"The Host Nation may fulfill the SEEBRIG CIS criteria in accordance with Appendix 2. Those criteria maybe amended by a PMSC decision"

## In Annex E Article 3 paragraph 1c (1), new subparagraphs (h) and (i) are inserted, to read as follows:

- "(h) All costs for the mission for HQ SEEBRIG, HQ COY and Signal COY will be funded from common budget excluding the costs for ROLE 3 medical treatment, salaries, per diem and travel expenses for personnel on leave.
- "i. Costs that will arise for food, accommodation and travelling for CE Personnel are National responsibility except TOA period to COMSEEBRIG. The TOA period will be decided for all Nations by the PMSC for each specific mission.

### Article 25

## In Annex E, Article 3 paragraph 1d of the Agreement, subparagraph (1) is amended, to read as follows:

"(1) Cost share is each Party's contribution to the common budget which will be calculated on the number of PHQ MPFSEE Peace Establishment (PE) slots allocated to each Party for the peace time. Vacant, rotational, and temporary augmentation slots will not affect cost share. In principle, the cost shares will be effective for the entire fiscal year. Therefore, any changes in the PE slot allocation during the FY will be effective on the cost shares of the Parties for the following FY. For the mission purposes the cost sharing formula is to be based on the number of CE slots allocated within the manning list adopted for the specific mission."

### Article 26

## In Annex E, Article 5, at the end of paragraph 1 a new sentence is inserted, to read as follows:

"For other situations than peace time, (missions, operations) the payment of contributions will be done in accordance with the decisions taken by PMSC, based on HQ SEEBRIG proposals."

#### Article 27

### In Annex E, Article 5, a new paragraph 6 is inserted, to read as follows:

"6. COMSEEBRIG is authorized to conclude contracts necessary for the peace time providing that these Effective Financial Limits of discretionary power are in accordance with APPENDIX 1 to ANNEX E. For the mission period COMSEEBRIG will be authorized by the PMSC to conclude contracts necessary for the mission providing that these are in accordance with Effective Financial Limits of discretionary power up to (30.000) EUROs for level A, (137.000) EUROs for level B and (211.000) EUROs for Level C. Over these limits COMSEEBRIG will require a specific PMSC approval."

### **Article 28**

## The titles of the Appendices of Annex A to the Agreement are amended, to read as follows:

APPENDIX-1: SEEBRIG general structure

APPENDIX-2: Troop Contributions by the Parties.

APPENDIX-3: Organization of SEEBRIG.

Updated versions of Appendices 2 and 3 to Annex A of the Agreement are attached.

### Article 30

The titles of the Appendices of Annex C to the Agreement are amended, to read as follows:

APPENDIX-1: HQ SEEBRIG structure during the peace time

APPENDIX-2: HQ SEEBRIG structure during the mission time

APPENDIX-3: HQ SEEBRIG Manning List during the peace time (NS)

APPENDIX-4: HQ SEEBRIG CE;

### **Article 31**

Updated versions of the Appendices 1, 2, 3 and 4 to Annex C to the Agreement and new Appendices 5 and 6 thereto are attached. The titles of the new Appendices 5 and 6 are as follows:

APPENDIX-5: Tentative HQ SEEBRIG Manning List during the mission time (PE + CE)

APPENDIX-6: CIS in deployed HQ locations.

### Article 32

The title of Appendix 1 to Annex D of the Agreement is amended to read as follows: APPENDIX-1: Host Nation Support for the establishment and functioning of the permanent HQ SEEBRIG. Furthermore, an updated version of Appendix 1 and a new Appendix 2 to Annex D are attached. The title of this new Appendix 2 is "SEEBRIG CIS Criteria".

### **Article 33**

Appendix 1 to ANNEX E of the Agreement is attached.

### Article 34

Updated version of the chart on HQ SEEBRIG LOCATION AND CRITICAL ROTATIONAL SLOTS which was attached to the First Additional Protocol of the Agreement and amended by the Fourth Additional Protocol thereto is hereby attached.


### Article 35





## **CIS IN DEPLOYED HQ LOCATIONS**

CIS in deployed HQ locations is a SEEBRIG HQ responsibility.

- a. The HQ may host, accommodate and integrate NATO CIS Services at the SEEBRIG HQ MAIN, with the following capabilities:
  - (1) SATCOM links into NATO CIS systems.
  - (2) LOS equipment.
  - (3) Short range LOS.
  - (4) Capability to establish a partial NS LAN.
  - (5) Capability to establish a partial Theatre SECRET LAN
  - (6) Capability to establish a partial NU LAN.
  - (7) A PABX (Switchboard) with partial telephone equipment for termination.
  - (8) Secure telephones (NBSVII).
  - (9) Secure VTC suite.
- b. The SEEBRIG HQ may be capable of installing the following services at the respective CPs and battalion HQ: Clarification comment: The following capabilities refer to the capabilities the SEEBRIG HQ/CIS units are responsible for.
  - (1) All necessary CIS inside the BDE for C2. [Clarification Comment: "Inside the Brigade" is to be interpreted as within and between all SEEBRIG Brigade command posts and to 1 level below the SEEBRIG HQ (up to 5 major subordinate HQs and up to 10 CS/CSS/other formations units HQ) In addition: NATO or other organizations may provide the transmission media, the "pipe" down to the SEEBRIG Command Post MAIN. The necessary equipment within the SEEBRIG Command Posts, the necessary transmission media between the SEEBRIG CPs and the necessary transmission media plus the necessary equipment to the next lower level, is the responsibility of the sponsoring Nation(s)/ SEEBRIG.]

### **APPENDIX 6 TO ANNEX C**

(ATTACHED TO THE FIFTH ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE AGREEMENT ON THE MULTINATIONAL PEACE FORCE SOUTH EASTERN EUROPE)

- (2) MCP may have access to NATO CIS through having interoperable equipment.
- (3) All necessary LAN equipment and manpower to enhance the partial LANs to make the HQ fully operational.
- (4) Additional voice and secure voice equipment.
- (5) All CIS may provide C2 for up to 5 major subordinate formations and up to 10 subordinate CS/CSS/other formations/units, with the following service, including CIS detachments/packages for these formations/units and the necessary CIS personnel to install, operate and maintain it.
  - i. M/TS network (Mission/Theatre SECRET)
  - ii. NU network.
  - iii. Secure and non-secure voice.
  - iv. Faxes deployable.
  - v. Secure faxes deployable.
  - vi. Capability to host NS LAN. (Provide Class II Area for partial NS LAN provided by NATO).
  - vii. Circuits and service can be extended to the receiving formations/units independently to their own CIS equipment and standards.
- c. SEEBRIG may develop Information Exchange Gateway (IEG) to link with other organization's CIS.
- d. The integral CIS units are located close to the HQ, are operational, and may maintain the following minimum service/capabilities:
  - (1) Secure, multi-channel trunk (LOS) system, providing secure and nonsecure voice and data communications to allow data exchange – to be provided to all deployed BDE HQ, major subordinate formations and all subordinate HQs.
  - (2) Capable data circuits are needed for the following services: Missionor Theatre- Secret Network, NU Net (Internet),
  - (3) Connectivity extendable to flanking formations (minimum the right neighbor), with similar service.

(ATTACHED TO THE FIFTH ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE AGREEMENT ON THE MULTINATIONAL PEACE FORCE SOUTH EASTERN EUROPE)

- (4) Be capable of extending SEEBRIG military voice and data systems LOS/SATCOM.
- (5) Be capable of extending HOST NATION PTT service.
- (6) SATCOM/LOS personnel and equipment are available for communications to all deployed BDE HQ, for up to 5 major subordinate formations and up to 10 CS/CSS/other formations/ units.
- (7) The SEEBRIG HQ can integrate in its own CIS all needed equipment (received from NATO) in order to have access to NATO satellite systems.
- (8) Secure CIS assets, as secondary means are available and operational (HF/VHF).
- (9) HQ's communications detachments can support up to 5 major subordinate formations and up to 10 CS/CSS/other formations/units with the necessary CIS service.

SEEBRIG security rules regarding the extension of SEEBRIG CIS and crypto to non-NATO troops do not limit operations.

## **SEEBRIG CIS CRITERIA**

- CIS CONNECTIVITY IN PEACE HQ. The Host Nation, on a voluntary basis, may provide the SEEBRIG HQ with integrated, effective and interoperable C2 and CIS capabilities, in order to conduct operations involving a wide variety of forces including non-NATO and Partner nations.
- a. The HQ may have access to NATO CIS, with the following services installed and operational:
  - (1) Connectivity to CSC (Circuit Switched Component), PTC (Packet Transport Component), and BME (Bandwidth Management Equipment).
  - (2) NATO Secret WAN/NS System High LAN.

(Clarification comment: Purchasing and installation of SEEBRIG HQ CIS equipment should be in accordance with NATO CIS Policies and procedures.

- b. The HQ may have a digital PABX, (Switchboard) with:
  - (1) Access to NATO NGCS (NATO General Communication System).
  - (2) Access to local and international PSTN.
  - (3) Access to HN military voice systems.
- c. The HQ may have an Unclassified LAN, with access to the Internet.
- d. The HQ may have equipment to terminate the CIS services, compatible to NATO standards:
  - (1) Phones.
  - (2) Secure phones.
  - (3) Faxes.
  - (4) Secure Faxes.
  - (5) Servers and routers to run the necessary data networks.
  - (6) Necessary LAN/WAN equipment.

#### **APPENDIX 2 TO ANNEX D**

(ATTACHED TO THE FIFTH ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE AGREEMENT ON THE MULTINATIONAL PEACE FORCE SOUTH EASTERN EUROPE)

- (7) Workstations for Internet.
- (8) Necessary crypto devices.

SEEBRIG HQ should preferable have its own NATO compatible crypto devices such as secure phones, secure faxes, bulk encryption devices and so on.

- e. SEEBRIG and NATO Key distribution is established and planned/ exercised for deployment.
- f. The HQ's ADP is modern may be capable of handling all NATO software applications (Operating System, Office Automation and Network Tools) in the English language.
- g. The HQ may have terminals for commercially provided analog, digital and ISDN circuits.
- h. The HQ has connectivity to HN/SEEBRIG military static and or mobile CIS systems.
- Affiliated formations/units could have available CIS at their Peace HQ for connectivity with SEEBRIG PHQ.
- j. The HQ is capable and has experienced manpower to conduct:
  - (1) Frequency management.
  - (2) Network management and local configuration control.
  - (3) Network administration.
  - (4) Network installation troubleshooting and repairs.
- k. HQ staff users are trained in the use of the specific software applications and COMPUSEC procedures by Nations before assignment and by SEEBRIG.
